Adult faith Formation

We have averaged about 12 people per evening participating in Bishop Robert Barrons' – Faith Clips on Monday evenings. We have received excellent feedback regarding the sessions completed so far. The sessions include scripture, prayer, song, a viewing of the Faith Clip Topic for the evening, and discussion. Topics covered to date are: God, The Trinity, Jesus, and Prayer. I asked Fr. Anthony to join us for the session on prayer and all appreciated Fr. Anthony spending some time taking us through Lectio Divina. The final session in this series will be on Monday November 20 and the topic is spirituality. Fr. Anthony may be able to join us again. The level of interest, participation and engagement among those attending our sessions at O.L.A. is encouraging and more will be planned for the spring.

Operation Archangel

Recent news stories underscore the importance of houses of worship taking steps to improve the safety of all who attend – 'hardening the target'- making it a less attractive/less easy target to exploit..

Periodic safety tips have been put in the bulletin. The special Orientation session for Ushers took place on Saturday October 14, with Bette Bonitz also in attendance. The meeting was led by Fr. Paul, myself, and Matt Ippolito, with Matt doing the Lion's share of it. While the safety of all was discussed, there was also emphasis on never losing sight of the fact that we are to continue to be a welcoming church. Some safety procedures and systems have been or are in the process of being put in place, none of which will appear in this report nor should appear in anything that might appear on the internet. We will be meeting shortly with a representative from the Sullivan County Sherriff to improve communication and further coordinate in case of an actual event, which we pray to God we never have to experience.

The Greater Middletown Interfaith Council's Warming Station for the homeless will be opening Sunday evening November 19 after a brief prayer service.
