Adult Faith Formation

The evening included some wonderful music, short witness, some papal humor, a viewing '*Pope Francis and the People*', table discussion and sharing, prayer, and a Pot Luck Supper. Feedback was extremely positive – and a real sense of community was present. My thanks go out to the entire team including table facilitators, those who helped with setup and cleanup, welcome and reception, those who helped during the registration period etc. While I generally do not mention individuals, I would be remiss if I did not include a special thank you and recognition of Sherri Rufer for her work coordinating the meal, and Bette Bonitz for her always beautiful music, and Kathy Fayol for her witness. And also a special thank you to Fr Anthony for joining us and for his blessing at the beginning and end of the evening.

'Making All Things New'

I invited any on the OLA MATN team who wanted to join me at the Archdiocesan sponsored meeting for MATN parish team leaders to come. Joe Hershel and I attended. Expectations were laid out regarding this implementation phase for each of the clusters. Our cluster has been expanded, now covering Holy Cross in South Centerville, Holy Name of Jesus in Otisville, and Immaculate Conception in Port Jervis, in addition to what it was with OLMC and its 2missions, St Joseph Middletown, St Joseph Wurtsboro.
