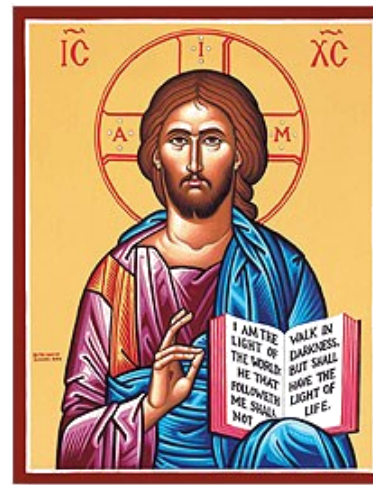

John the Baptist, the last of the prophets, proclaimed a baptism of repentance.

The difference between John's baptism and Christian baptism was one of repentance, while Christian Baptism is one of repentance and reception of the Holy Spirit that makes us children of God. Even John the Baptist gave witness that he was not the Messiah. John spoke of Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, while he gave witness that he was not even worthy to untie Jesus' sandals.
