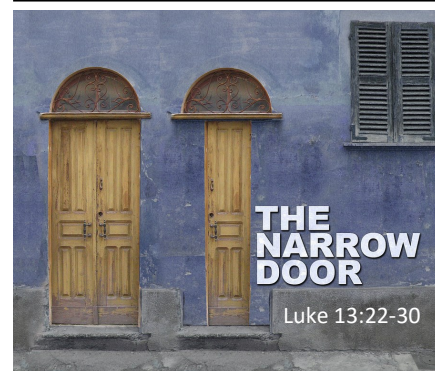

 12:5-7, 11-13

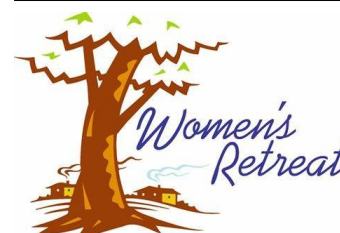
Luke 13:22-30

*As a child,  
 we need to be taught clear boundaries.*

The Lord uses discipline with us, just as a parent might discipline a child. The parent does not punish the child because it makes the parent feel good, but rather because it is in the best interest of the child.

If a child is not punished, then he or she might not learn to distinguish between right and wrong. That would be a form of child abuse. Obviously, our understanding of what punishment means today is significantly different from what would have been understood when today's passage from Hebrews was written.

Nevertheless, it remains true that children need clear boundaries if they are to develop a balanced moral life.
