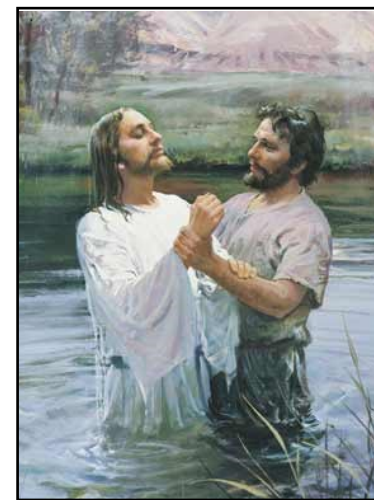

Genesis 18:20-32

Our Baptism, symbolically, is a process of dying and rising to life.

We die to our old way of life. We have to give up the life of sin and self-indulgence in which we were involved. At the same time, Jesus offers us the possibility of living a new life that has true meaning, one that is filled with love.

There is also the symbolism of being bound and being free. In our old days, we were bound in sin (we could not free ourselves from it). Now, sin has been bound (nailed to the cross) so that we might be free. This does not mean that we can do whatever we want to, but rather in means that we have the freedom to choose love and life.
