Why do we do things we do? Do we do them for prestige, to be thought of as important or good or nice? Or do we do them as an expression of love?

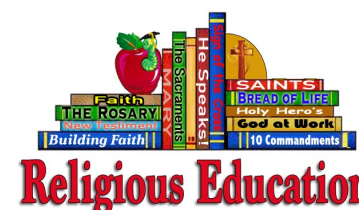
Whom would we invite for a meal? Will we invite those who can pay us back, or will we invite those who most need an expression of our love and generosity?
