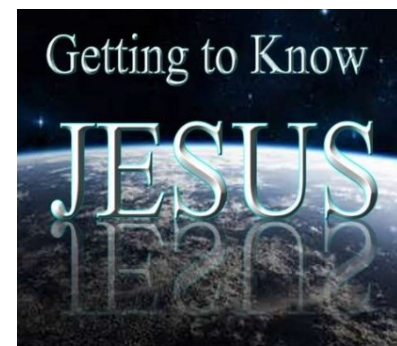

### Today's Scripture

2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Samuel 3:3b-10,19  
 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20

John 1:35-42

*Jesus is the only truth in our lives that does not fail us. He is the source of grace, which is such profound life in God that even death cannot defeat it.*

We have all received a vocation, a call from God. At its most basic level, we have all received a call to salvation. Several times in the New Testament we hear that our names have been written in the Book of Life before the foundation of the world.

We also have received a more specific call on how we are to live out this more general call. Some of us are called to be married, others single. This is not a question of personal preference—it is a response to God's call.

Finally, our work is also part of our response to our vocation. We are not simply earning a living; we also are responding to God's call in whatever work we do. If we keep this fact in mind, then we can see how whatever work we might do, even forms of work that seem to be quite humble, can be for us an expression of our dedication to the spreading of the Kingdom of God.

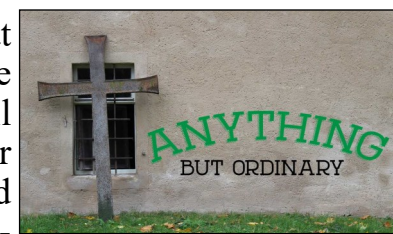

### What is Ordinary Time?

In the liturgy of the Roman Rite, Ordinary Time, in Latin Tempus per annum, it is that time of the liturgical year which is not connected directly

with one of the great seasons, Christmastide and Eastertide, as well as the times of their preparation, Lent and Advent. Thus, the Ordinary Time of the liturgical year splits in the days between Christmastide and Lent, and that between Eastertide and Advent. The last Sunday of Ordinary Time is the Solemnity of Christ the King. The liturgical color assigned to Ordinary Time is green. The word "ordinary" as used here comes from the ordinal numerals by which the weeks are identified or counted, from the 1<sup>st</sup> week of Ordinary Time in January to the 34<sup>th</sup> week that begins toward the end of November; Ordinary Time is interrupted by Lent and Eastertide.



**Why is ordinary time called ordinary?** Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" because the weeks are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Catholics are unique in the fact that we proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ formally every day in our daily Mass readings. You do not cease to gather together with Your Word, a holy people from every land, city, and nation, so that in charity they may offer worship that is pleasing to you.
