2nd Sunday in Lent

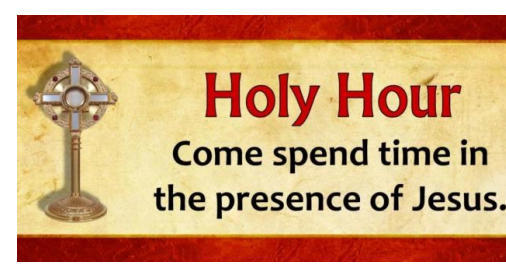
Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God is on our side; he has already proven that abundantly.

Baptism is seen as a washing to remove the contagion of sin (and not the cleansing from physical dirtiness). The ark that saved Noah from the flood is a type of prefiguring of the Sacrament of Baptism (for in Baptism we are saved from the flood of sin and lies that surrounded us).

Jesus preached to those who were in prison. The belief is that after Jesus died on the cross, he descended down into the underworld (sometimes called hell or hades or Sheol).

He did this in order to proclaim his message of salvation to those who had died before he was born.
