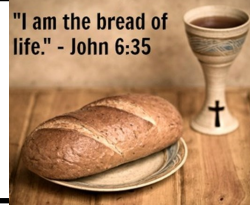

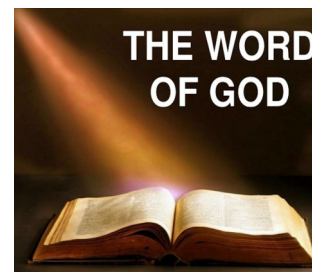

Assumption of Mary

1 Kings 19:4-8 Ephesians 4:30-5:2
John 6:41-51

Jesus is the bread of life that has come down from heaven and that satisfies our most profound hunger.

St. Augustine teaches that we must become that which we eat: the body of Christ. Just as the Holy Spirit hallows the loaves on the altar to become the body of Christ, so also that same Holy Spirit hallows us (as we will read in the Ephesians passage listed above) to become the Mystical Body of Christ.

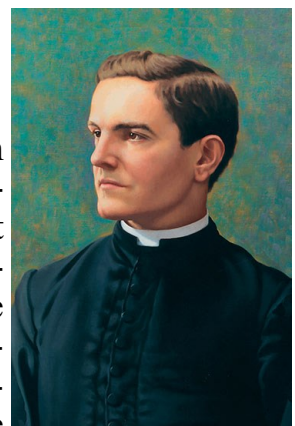

Rev. Michael Joseph McGivney was an Irish-American Catholic priest based in New Haven, Connecticut. He founded the Knights of Columbus at a local parish to serve as a mutual aid and fraternal insurance organization, particularly for immigrants and their families. His Vision was for Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.



Fr. McGivney healed preborn Mikey Schachle of a life-threatening condition. This miracle paved the way for Father McGivney's Beatification and the path to sainthood. *(See today's insert.)*
