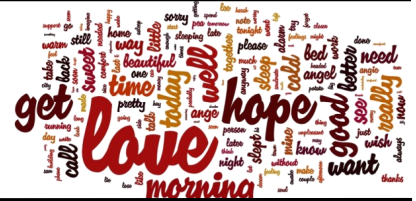

Today's Scripture

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Genesis 2:18-24
Hebrews 2:9-11
Mark 10:2-16

The question of divorce heard in the Gospel is not one of law, but rather one of love of God and love of one's brothers and sisters.

While Jesus clearly condemned divorce, he also called upon us to love the broken. It is a great pastoral challenge to be faithful to both of these values.

Jesus welcomed and blessed the little children that were brought to him, despite the fact that his disciples felt it was bothersome for him to do so He told his disciples that they must learn from and become like those children (filled with simplicity and innocence and not with the hunger or power that they were so often exhibiting in today's Gospel reading).

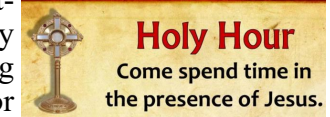
