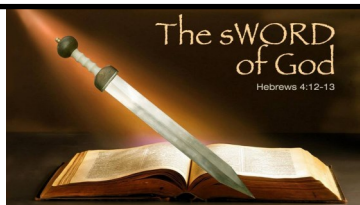

THE WORD



Today's Scripture

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 7:7-11
 Hebrews 4:12-13
 Mark 10:17-30

It has been said that if the Word of God does not in some way challenge us, then we probably have missed its point.

God challenges us in the same way that Jesus challenged the rich young man in today's Gospel reading. He invites us to go beyond the rules with a faith that is unconditional. This means letting go of what is comfortable. It involves saying "no" to some things so that we might say "yes" to that which is more important.

In other words, what would we be willing to give up, if we could not have both it and God—money? Prestige? Our health? Our family? Our life?

No wonder the rich young man's face fell. No wonder that he thought that Jesus was asking the impossible of him. Yet, the irony is that no matter how much we hold on to of what we think is precious, we will sooner or later have to give it up as well.

 Starting a School**

Sr. Nora Cunningham, S.C., working in tandem with Sr. Margaret Ellen Burke, S.C., has been a friend of OLA for the last 30+ years. They have provided training for our liturgical ministers, facilitated a directed retreat for the Parish, run workshops and so much more. We heard recently from Sr. Margaret Ellen that Sr. Nora would be playing an integral role in helping establish a new school in Guatemala, and could use our help. Please read the following communication from Sr. Nora

and, if possible, contribute something toward this much needed project, and of course, keep all in your prayers.

The New Mission of Starting a School in Nebaj, Quiche in Guatemala

Sr. Nora told us, "The school is for grades 7-8-9 (Basico - the level of Jr. HS in Guatemala) since that is the need. It will be the only Catholic School in this poor area. We hope to begin in January 2023. Hopefully Covid will be under control. The school year in Guatemala is Jan-Nov. We have 2 young sisters who will go there plus lay teachers. The name of the school will be Colegio de Santa Elizabeth Seton and it will be under the protection of the martyrs of Quiche, who were just beatified this year (3 priests and 7 lay people).

We are hoping to start a scholarship fund for the poorer students. Tuition would be about \$40 a month. The school year is about 10 months. Donations for the school in Guatemala would be directed to:
