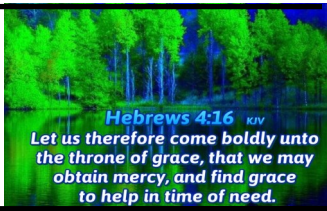

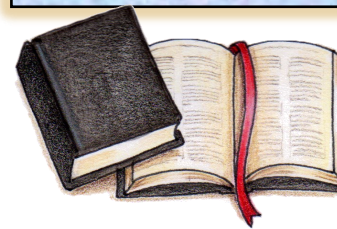
Isaiah 53:10-11

It is in the Gospel of Mark that we see most clearly how Jesus overturns the values of our society. Power, prestige and wealth are no longer important. What is most important is our willingness to express our love in service of others. These truths are called Gospel irony, for they make no sense in the logic of this world; there is a great wisdom, however, that St. Paul calls the wisdom of the cross.

The boat is a frequent symbol used by the Church. Through the centuries, and even to this day, the Church is tossed about in the turbulent seas of life. Yet, it is Jesus who calms our fears with the simple gesture of his hand. Saint Augustine, who commented on today's scriptures in the fourth century, said, "Jesus Christ dwells in you through faith. Faith present in your heart is Jesus Christ present. Watchful faith is Jesus Christ watching. Sleeping faith is Jesus Christ asleep. Therefore, wake him up, arouse yourself and make this prayer, "Teacher, we are perishing."
