*There are times in our lives

At times, it is faith of the people that produces the miracles (e.g., here the woman with the hemorrhage); at other times Jesus performs the miracles and the people acquire faith through what has happened (e.g. the Wedding Feast of Cana).

At times it can seem all but impossible to believe that things will get better, but God does bring back the exiles (whether they be the exiles in Babylon or our exiles hearts that have been broken). The restoration does not always come in the way we had hoped, but it always comes in the way that we need.

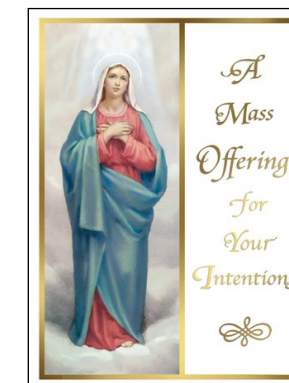
