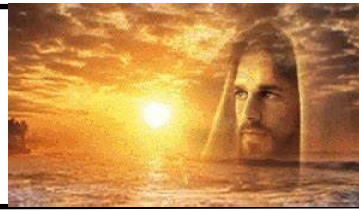

Today's Scripture

33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Daniel 12:1-3
Hebrews 10:11-14, 18
Mark 13:24-32

We must always be ready for the return of the Lord in glory, for we know neither the time or the place.

Jesus was the perfect High Priest who offered the sacrifice of his life and love once and for all time. There was no need to repeat this sacrifice, for it was perfectly effective in obtaining the forgiveness of our sins.

When we celebrate the Eucharist, we are not repeating the sacrifice of Jesus one more time. At Mass, we pass outside of the normal understanding of time and place.

We are present again at the Last Supper and Mount Calvary. We are not repeating it; we are once again present at it.

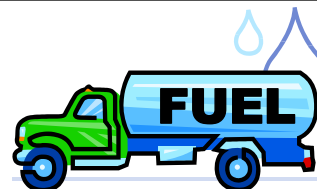
