

Today's Scripture Readings



8th Sunday in **Ordinary Time**

Sirach 27:4-7 1 Corinthians 15:54-58 Luke 6:39-45

We must give witness to what we are. We must be willing to shine like lights n a world so often shrouded by the clouds of sin and selfishness.

There is a story about a man who was worried that his wife was losing her hearing. He asked a doctor how he might discover if it really was a problem. The doctor told the man to stand 15 feet behind his wife and say something, then see how close to her he had to move for her to hear what he was saying.

He stood 15 feet behind her and asked what they were going to have for supper. There was no answer. So he moved up 5 feet and asked her again. Once more, there was no answer. He moved 5 feet closer, but still there was no answer.

Finally, he was standing alongside his wife. He asked her what was for supper. She turned to him with a frustrated look on her face and responded, "For the fourth time, chicken."

It is so easy to see the flaws in others, yet so difficult to see them in ourselves.
