
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# **Today's Scripture Readings**



### 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent

Joshua 5:9a, 10-12 2 Corinthians 5:17-21 Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

### We are all called to abandon our sinful ways and return to our merciful Father.

Saint Paul says that Jesus became sin, meaning that he took the curse of our sings upon himself. He put the old ways (of selfishness and alienation) to death. Now we have to choose life and love.

There are a number of passages in the New Testament that present the idea that we are a new creation. When Jesus is buried in the Gospel of John, he is buried in a garden (signifying the garden of Eden.

He breathes on his disciples after the resurrection (just as God breathed into the mud to create Adam). The Spirit is a great wind on the Day of Pentecost (just as the Spirit hovered over the waters on the day of creation.
