Today's Scripture Readings

THE WORD
OF GOD



PALM SUNDAY

Isaiah 50:4-7

Philippians 2:6-11

Luke 22:14-23:56

*We can easily forget that Psalm 22
was written several hundreds of years
before the time of Jesus. It fills us with a
dcsense of awe, for here we see the Holy Spirit
inspiring the psalmist in a powerful way.*

Saint Paul presents this hymn (Philippians 2:6-11) as an example of the profound humility of Jesus who surrendered his prerogatives as God to serve us as a human.

The phrase, "form of God," means that Jesus is God, even as God the Father is God. Yet Jesus emptied himself of his godliness. The word "empty," *kenosis* in Greek, signifies a spirituality of surrender and humility. It does not mean that he stopped being God.

The ultimate degree of humility was to be obedient to the Father, even to the point of dying on the cross. We might think that this expression of humility was humiliating for Jesus, but he did not see it that way. He saw it as the fullest expression of his love and trust in the Father. God, the Father, responded to this trust by proclaiming Jesus as Lord, a title that affirms his divinity.
