

Today's Scripture Readings



THE WORD Divine Mercy

Acts 5:12-16 Revelation 1:9-11a. 12-13, 17-19 John 20:19-31

We have not seen the risen Jesus, we have not touched him with our hands. Yet we have believed in him because of what others have told us, and because we have experienced his love.

Today's Gospel presents two encounters with the risen Jesus. In the first, Jesus appears to the disciples on the evening of Easter Sunday. He greets them with the phrase, "Peace be with you."

This peace, Shalom in Hebrew, is a peace that goes beyond an absence of turmoil. It is a peace so profound that no one can steal it away from us.

Jesus also breathes on the disciples. When God created Adam, he breathed upon a lump of clay and made it into a living human being.

Something of God, God's own breath or Spirit, is inside of us. When we sin, we reject that breath of the Holy One. Now Jesus is recreating us by placing that breath, the Spirit of God, back inside of us. That Spirit enables us to be instruments of the forgiveness of sins (for the Spirit is the love of God that fills us with God's mercy.)

A Gift of the Rosary

A parishioner at Mount Carmel recalls that he was challenged by a young Carmelite to pray the Rosary every day. Now, this parishioner wishes to give other people the oppor-

tunity to join in that prayer. He has purchased rosaries that will be given to all who wish to receive them. He only asks that we would pray the Rosary every day for Vocations in the Church and for the sanctification of one another. Thank you.
