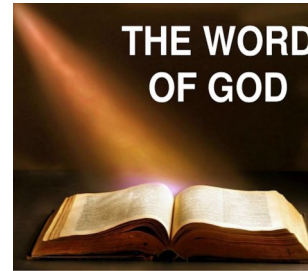

Today's Scripture Readings



5th Sunday of Lent

Ezekiel 37:12-14
 Romans 8:8-11
 John 11:1-45

Jesus is the source and the goal of our lives. Life has no meaning if it is not lived in him and for him.

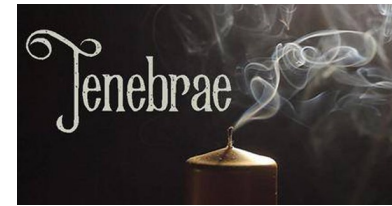
In the passage from Romans, we hear of the contrast between living according to the flesh and living according to the Spirit. By using the word flesh, Paul is not speaking about our bodies or the created world. He is speaking about that part of us which drags us down, which will lead us to sin. Saint Augustine calls this concupiscence.

The Spirit, on the other hand, is the gift of the Holy Spirit that we have received in our Baptism. We can live in the Spirit by choosing to live in God's love.

The life that we receive from the Spirit is so profound that even our mortal bodies will be filled with eternal life in the resurrection from the dead.

Tenebrae (/ˈtɛnəbreɪ, -brɪ/ [1]—Latin for “darkness”) is a religious service of Western Christianity generally held during the three days preceding

Easter Day, and characterized by gradual extinguishing of candles, and by a “strepitus” or “loud noise” taking place in total darkness near the end of the service.
