Today's Scripture Readings



Ascension of Our Lord

Acts 15: 1-2, 22-29

Revelation 21:10-14. 22-23

John 14:23-29

It is not enough to say that we believe in God, but then not do anything about it. We must keep God's word by living his commandments.

This is the way that we will know that we are living in the truth.

There are various functions for the Paraclete described in John's Gospel. In this passage we hear that the Paraclete will remind us of what Jesus taught, for the disciples were incapable of remembering what was important on their own. The Paraclete would also teach the disciples right from the start.

The Spirit is also presented as an intercessor for Christians before the Father. The Spirit gives consolation to those who are suffering. (In fact, Paul states that a sign that one is filled with the Spirit is that one suffers with a spirit of joy.) The Spirit strengthens Christians.

Furthermore, the Spirit was always associated with the forgiveness of sins. The Spirit is God's love (which is why it is seen as a dove, a symbol of love in the old Testament). God's love heals the wounds caused by our sins, for sins are acts of non-love.
