

Today's Scripture Readings



Seventh Sunday of Easter

Acts 1:1-11 Ephesians 1:17-23 John 14:23-29

Jesus came into this world so that we would never be lonely again. Sin causes alienation. Jesus heals the wounds of sin with his love so that we might enter into the life of the Trinity.

Jesus identifies himself as the Alpha and Omega. Alpha is the first and Omega is the last letter of the Greek alphabet, and ot means that Jesus is the source and the goal of all that exists.

Jesus also identifies himself as the root and offspring of David (for while he is a descendant of David, he also existed long before David did).

He is also the bright morning star. The morning star is Venus, who in Greek mythology was the goddess of victory. Jesus, like the morning star, rose before the dawn.

The Spirit and the bride (the Church) invite us to come and share in the goodness that God offers us.
