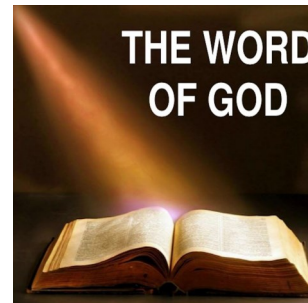

Today's Scripture Readings



THE WORD
OF GOD

4th Sunday of Easter

Acts 13:14, 43-52

Revelation 7:9, 14b-17

John 10:27-30

Jesus is the Good Shepherd. He will never abandon his flock, but will be willing to give up his life for the sheep whom he loves.

Sheep are not the most intelligent of animals. They often graze on hillsides that are too steep and they fall over on their backs. Once they have fallen over, they cannot right themselves. If they were to be left there, they would die. Because of this, the shepherd has to keep a constant eye on the sheep lest they place themselves in danger.

Jesus proclaims that he is the Good Shepherd. Jesus does not proclaim this on his own authority, but rather because the Father has appointed him to this role. Jesus must obey the will of the Father (for he and the Father are one). The will of the Father is to reveal to us how much God loves us. The Gospel of John presents the cross as the most powerful example of the love.
