Today's Scripture Readings



The Most Holy Trinity

Proverbs 8:22-31 Romans 8:1-8 John 16:12-15

Glory to the Father, to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was, and who is to *come.* (This is a doxology (short hymn of praise) to the three persons of The Blessed Trinity, God who is Father, Son and the Holy spirit.

The Trinity offers an alternative vision to how our human society can be structured. We often think in terms of competition. We might believe that if someone else profits in any other way, then it must be stolen from me. This is called a zero based mentality in which there is only so much to go around and one must fight to maintain one's own portion.

The Trinity is a society based on cooperation and mutual respect. The Son willingly obeys the Father out of love, never feeling that this robs him of his dignity. The Father only wants what is good for the Son. The Spirit is that love which unites the Father and the Son and us. How much healthier our societies (families, parishes, clubs, etc.) would be if they were based on the relationship of the Trinity.
