

Today's Scripture Readings



PENTECOST

Acts 2:1-11 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 John 20:19-23

We invite the Holy Spirit into our lives and our hearts. Without the love that the Spirit imparts, we cannot hope to live in God's love.

The Spirit is called a divine light. We do not know our way to God, but the Spirit illumines our thoughts and prayers. The Spirit is a comforter. This is one of the meanings of the title "Paraclete."

We need to experience God's love that is communicated through the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is the love between the Father and the Son and between them and us.

The Spirit fills up the void in our heart. We long for fulfillment, yet so often we seek it in things that do not bring true joy and peace. The Spirit responds to our deepest aspirations. We receive healing, both spiritual and physical, through the action of the Holy Spirit.

We also speak of the seven gifts that the Spirit has given us. Seven is the perfect number and therefore these gifts are symbolic of the incredible multiplicity of gifts that the Spirit pours out upon us. They allow us to continue the work of God in the world.

This year marks 45 years that our Church has staged SummerFest, a major fundraising and community building event. People come from all over to participate in the various activities that comprise SummerFest. Most well


-known are the Flea Market, Tricky Tray and Chicken Barbecue. To make it successful, we need your help! Here's how:
