ABOUT THE LITURGY: Remembering: Anamnesis 3

Last week we began looking at anamnesis and its critical role in our worship. This has its roots in the Jewish celebration of the Passover. When the Passover is celebrated, then the power of the First Passover with Moses is once more present before us. When Jesus says at the Last Supper, "Do this in memory of me," he means that celebrating the Eucharist, as he just did, would make him present once more before us.

Outside of the Eucharist, we may find instances of anamnesis in the rites of Baptism. The blessing of the water is a powerful memorial of how water saves us in history. Prior to the words of blessing, great moments of God's breaking into our lives are recalled: the creation story, Noah and the flood, the exodus through the sea, Jesus' baptism, the blood and water that flowed from his side from the cross, and the disciples being sent to baptized are all united in the one moment of blessing the water.

At the same time, anamnesis in our liturgies looks forward to the Parousia – the second coming of Christ and the fulfillment of all our hopes and longings. In the liturgy, this is all one.

Assumption of Mary

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a **dogma of faith**: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory."

The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church

16. The saving work of Jesus Christ, which has brought to fulfillment what was announced in figure in the Passover, is now re-presented in the celebration of the Eucharist. The Eucharist "makes present the one sacrifice of Christ the Savior." As Pope St. John Paul II taught: "The Church constantly draws her life from [this] redeeming sacrifice; she approaches it not only



through faith-filled remembrance, but also through a real contact, since this sacrifice is made present ever anew, sacramentally perpetuated, in every community which offers it at the hands of the consecrated minister."

17. Finally, this great sacrament is also a participation in the worship offered in heaven, in and through Christ, by the angels and saints. Pope Benedict XVI explained that every eucharistic celebration sacramentally accomplishes the eschatological gathering of the People of God. For us, the eucharistic banquet is a real foretaste of the final banquet foretold by the prophets (cf. Is 25:6-9) and described in the New Testament as "the marriage-feast of the Lamb" (Rev 19:7-9), to be celebrated in the joy of the communion of saints.

Your Parish Council

The Parish Council consists of a group of volunteers who meet on a monthly basis (more frequently, if needed) to provide oversight for the operation of our Church and Parish Center. At their meetings they review current financials, hear reports from the various areas (Fr. Paul, pastoral assistant, religious education, buildings & grounds, etc.), and discuss the overall life of the Parish including any projects, events and activities that relate to Our Lady of the Assumption Church.

The Parish Council is in need of two new members to begin a 3-year term this September. Criteria is that the person be an active member of our Church and at least 18 years of age. There is also an opening for a Youth Member who must be at least 14 years old.

Additionally we are in need of a volunteer to serve as one of two Trustees. Responsibilities are similar to those listed above as well as being the legal corporate representatives of the Parish.
