Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 Luke 17:5-10

ABOUT THE LITURGY: Harden Not Your Hearts

There is a peculiar interchange between the First Reading today, and the Responsorial Psalm. In the reading from the Prophet Habakkuk, there is a cry from the heart that is all too familiar to us: "How long, O LORD? I cry for help, but you do not listen!" How often has such a cry came from our own hearts as we look upon great distress, senseless violence, and horrendous evil being played out in our midst? How often have we accused God of being asleep at the wheel, allowing things to take place that he should certainly condemn?

Yet, the wisdom of the Church in choosing this passage as the First Reading also leads her to choose Psalm 95 as the Responsorial Psalm that advises us: "If today you hear his voice, harden not your heart." The psalmist seems to be telling us that God does indeed respond to our cries and laments, but we are often deaf to what he has to say.

In fact, the actual celebration of the liturgy, especially the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, is God's response to the evil of this world. As we receive the Body and Blood of the One who answered evil with the obedience of his sacrifice on the Cross, then we are also called to be the ones who answer the evil that surrounds with our own deeds of obedient and sacrificial acts of love. After all, God made us to be his instruments in the world.

II. OUR RESPONSE

29. In the fourth Common Preface of the Roman Missal, the priest prays the following: For, although you have no need of our praise, yet our thanksgiving is itself your gift, since our praises add nothing to your greatness but profit us for salvation . . .

These words speak of the grace of God, the gift freely given, which inspires us to give thanks and worship him, works our transformation into the likeness of Christ, helps us to seek pardon and to receive it when we fall into sin, and impels us to go forth and bear witness to Christ in the world.

A) Thanksgiving and Worship

30. Having been sanctified by the gift of the Eucharist and filled with faith, hope, and charity, the faithful are called to respond to this gift. Indeed, it is only natural that we give thanks to the Lord for all that he has given to us. How can I repay the Lord for all the great good done for me? I will raise the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord (Ps 116:12). The word "Eucharist" literally means "thanksgiving." Even our manner of giving thanks comes from God, for we do so by following the command of the Lord: do this in memory of me (Lk
