ABOUT THE LITURGY:

Built of Living Stones – Part 3

When speaking of the Music Ministry, *Built of Living Stones* takes care to regard these ministers as part of the congregation. That is, they are part of the parish family, engaging in peer of ministry, and so the architect and layout of the physical church building should reflect that.

“The ministers of music could also be located in the body of the church since they lead the entire assembly in song as well as by the example of their reverent attention and prayer” (BLS 51). By placing the ministers within the assembly, *Built of Living Stones* reinforces that they are part of the family of faith and are indeed leading from within. This is later reemphasized: “Because the roles of the choirs and cantors are exercised within the liturgical community, the space chosen for the musicians should clearly express that they are part of the assembly of worshipers” (89).

Churches vary greatly in this area. Some have the musicians up and behind the congregation, some have them in front of all. Nevertheless, the call is to regard the musicians as fellow parishioners who help the entire assembly to worship God. They are not present to make a performance, even as they sing so well. Their purpose is to help all of us to grow closer to God in song.

The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church

22. When the Eucharist is distributed and the minister says, “the Body of Christ,” we are to look not simply at what is visible before our eyes, but at what it has become by the words of Christ and the gift of the Holy Spirit—the Body of Christ. The communicant’s response of “Amen” is a profession of faith in the Real Presence of Christ and reflects the intimate personal encounter with him, with his gift of self, that comes through reception of Holy Communion.



23. The Church’s firm belief in the Real Presence of Christ is reflected in the worship that we offer to the Blessed Sacrament in various ways, including Eucharistic Exposition, Adoration, and Benediction; Eucharistic Processions; and Forty Hours Devotions. In addition, the practices of reverently genuflecting before the Blessed Sacrament reserved in the tabernacle, bowing one’s head prior to the reception of Holy Communion, and refraining from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Communion are clear manifestations of the Church’s Eucharistic faith.
