ABOUT THE LITURGY: Finding Jov

Take some time during this season of preparation to think of the things that bring you the most joy: moments that make your soul sing, conversations that revive your spirit, situations that grant hope in the darkness. Pope Francis reminds us in his encyclical, Evangelii Gaudium, that "the joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus" (EG1). On this Gauedeté Sunday, we are reminded of the encounter and experience of the presence of Jesus in the blind, lame, labor, death, dead, and poor. Pope Francis' call beckons us to an understanding of the joy of salvation rooted in encounter with Christ, found present in each other. Look for signs of joy, for signs of life, and of the saving action of God in our daily routine.

While we await the coming of the Lord, rejoice in the present and patient waiting. Embrace a patient trust in God. A deep encounter with Christ dwells in these moments of peace and integrity when we seek to trust God through the despair and distress that threatens our lives. In this world, despite the evil that surrounds us, we can praise our faithful God for these moments of joy, and plead for God to come quickly and save us.

The Mystery of the Eucharist in the Life of the Church

II. OUR RESPONSE **B.** Conversion

49. One's communion with Christ and his Church, therefore, involves both one's "invisible communion" (being in the state of grace), and one's "visible communion." St. John Paul II explained: The judgment of one's state of



grace obviously belongs only to the person involved, since it is a question of examining one's conscience. However, in cases of outward conduct which is seriously, clearly and steadfastly contrary to the moral norm, the Church, in her pastoral concern for the good order of the community and out of respect for the sacrament, cannot fail to feel directly involved. The Code of Canon Law refers to this situation of a manifest lack of proper, moral disposition when it states that those who 'obstinately persist in the manifest grave sin' are not to be admitted to Eucharistic communion.

It is the special responsibility of the diocesan bishop to work to remedy situations that involve public actions at variance with the visible communion of the Church and the moral law. Likewise, the Code of Canons of the Eastern Churches states that "those who are publicly unworthy are forbidden from receiving Divine Eucharist. So must he guard the integrity of the sacrament, the visible communion of the Church, and the salvation of others.
