*About Prayer: **Sacred Space***

Last Wednesday when we received ashes, we heard in the Gospel Reading about the three important practices of Lent: Almsgiving, Prayer and Fasting. Without neglecting the other, it might be helpful for one to consider setting up at home a sacred space for Prayer.

This sacred space can be simple, not at all elaborate. A corner or even a space of wall will do. A cross, a candle, and a Bible or prayer book will complete the space. These items could have special significance: a cross from a pilgrimage, a candle from a friend, or a book from one's grandmother. Or they could be newly purchased with the intention of being used in this sacred space. Anything that would help us pray is good.

It would be helpful to spend some minutes in the sacred space in the morning and/or in the evening. One could read the Gospel of the day, or pray the Rosary, or make a spiritual Stations of the Cross. A family or a couple might decide to pray together. The important thing is to set regular times for about 15 minutes of prayer. That should give us the help we need to fast and give alms during this holy season.
