Today's Scripture 1st Sunday in Lent

Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7 Romans 5:12-19 Matthew 4:1-11

About Prayer: Nothing Spectacular

When the devil was tempting Jesus in the desert, the second temptation was for Jesus to fling himself down from the temple, in order to make a spectacular show of God's power. Jesus' response to the tempter is also meant to inspire us: "You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

Looking for a spectacular way to show God's power is really an expression of doubt in God's complete and unconditional acceptance of us. In the center of all things, and of life, is the presence of God who assures and affirms us, freeing us from the compulsion to be praised and admired. The work of our hands ought to point to God and not to ourselves. To reach this center requires time spend in deep prayer, and Lent is the best time to begin praying deeply.

Today we see in the Gospel Reading, Jesus in his heavenly glory. But before that glory is reached, Jesus must first be raised from the dead, emphasizing the paschal mystery and that there can be no eternal life with God without death. Dying to our desire for the spectacular is part of our journey to the heart of God. In that Sacred Heart, God's acceptance frees us of being needy. Through prayer and communion with God practiced during Lent, we find our true selves called to live according to God's truth and love.

Visio Divina

Please make a point to visit the new sacred art display in the Church Gathering Area that is an example of Visio Divina. Visio Divina — "sacred seeing" — is an ancient form of Christian prayer in which we allow our hearts and imaginations to

enter into a sacred image, in silence, to see what God might have to say to us.

The display changes weekly to correspond with Scriptures from the weekend Masses. Ted Wall coordinates this display by researching the content of the Scriptures


