About the Liturgy: "To Be An Onion

While Jesus challenges us today in the Gospel Reading to be salt and light in the world, we can also learn a valuable lesson from the ordinary onion.

When cooking a dinner, one usually spends a good deal of time preparing the onions, yet when diners comment about the meal, they rarely mention them. It may seem as if the onion disappears for the sake of the other ingredients, yet its presence is absolutely necessary for the meal to taste right.

Akin to salt and light, the onion is there to enhance the food that is already around it. You might say that salt, light, and the onion are able to make changes for the better when used in the right proportions, and then they seemingly disappear. In the same way, our presence in the Church on Sundays enhances those already around us, making a change for the better, even as we remain quietly in the background. No matter what, our Christian presence has an impact on the world.
